

Act Now to Continue Receiving Information About This Site!

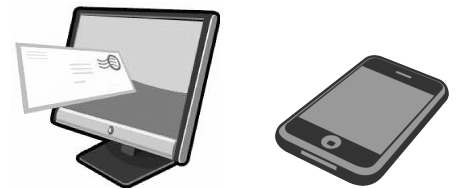
DEC's Division of Environmental Remediation (DER) now distributes information about contaminated sites electronically by email.

If you would like to continue to receive information about the contaminated site featured in this fact sheet:

You must sign up for the DER email listserv:

DER cannot register your email address - only the email address owner can do so. If you already have signed up for the listserv for the county in which the site is located, you need do nothing.

Cleanup Action Completed at Brownfield Site

Action has been completed to address the contamination related to the 1036 Manhattan Ave BCP site ("site") located at 170 Freeman Street in Brooklyn, Kings County under New York State's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP). Please see the map for the site location.

Cleanup activities were performed by 170 Freeman LLC and BK Corners LLC (collectively the "applicant") with oversight provided by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC). The applicant has submitted a proposed Final Engineering Report (FER) for NYSDEC review which states that cleanup requirements have been or will be achieved to fully protect public health and the environment for the proposed site use.

Highlights of the Site Cleanup

The following activities have been completed under an Interim Remedial Measure to achieve the remedial action objectives for restricted residential use. This work was documented in an IRM Construction Completion Report dated July 2025.

- Excavation and off-site disposal of contaminated soil exceeding the restricted residential soil cleanup objectives (SCOs) in the upper 15 feet in the partial basement of the new development, and in the upper 2 feet in the remainder of the site;
- Groundwater treatment through in-situ (i.e. in place) bio-remedial injections;
- Collection and analysis of post-remedial soil and groundwater samples to evaluate the effectiveness of the remedy;
- Importing clean material that meets the applicable SCOs for use as backfill;
- Installation of an active sub-slab depressurization system;
- Installation of a site cover system; and
- Implementing a Health and Safety Plan and Community Air Monitoring Plan during all ground intrusive activities.

The following activities have been completed as part of the No Further Action Remedial Action Work Plan dated October 2025:

- Development of a Site Management Plan (SMP) for long-term management of remaining contamination as required by the Environmental Easement, including plans for: (1) Institutional and Engineering Controls (IC/ECs); (2) monitoring; (3) operation and maintenance; and (4) reporting.
- Recording of an Environmental Easement to control land use and prevent future exposure to any contamination remaining at the site.

Next Steps

When NYSDEC approves the FER, it will be made available to the public (see "Where to Find Information"). NYSDEC then will issue a Certificate of Completion (COC) that will be announced in a fact sheet. The applicant(s) would be able to redevelop the site after receiving a COC. In addition, the applicant(s) will be eligible for tax credits to offset a portion of the costs of performing cleanup activities and for redevelopment of the site.

Site Description

The site is 0.23-acres and is bordered on the west by Manhattan Avenue, on the south by a new 7-story mixed-use residential and commercial development, on the east by multi-story residential building and on the north by Freeman Avenue. Previously, the site was occupied by various businesses including a hardware store, paints shop and auto parts shop between 1928 and 2007 and a dry cleaner between 1949 and 2007. Site was developed during Interim Remedial Measures (IRM) activities into an eight-story commercial and residential building with approximately 15% of the units designated as affordable housing.

Brownfield Cleanup Program

New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by DEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.
